## **Competencies Review Worksheet**

- 1. CMC students have instructions in first week of Modules 5 and 10 to contact their mentor for an appointment to review competencies.
- 2. Prior to that meeting the mentor should evaluate the student for each competency in all the modules studied to date. Mark using the CMC Rubric: Exemplary, Outstanding, Acceptable, Needs Improvement.
- 3. During meeting, go through each item, tell the student their score, discuss as needed. Offer critique and suggestions as appropriate. Note that awarding of a certificate is contingent on performance.
- 4. During discussion, whenever possible note the relevance of a competency to ministry to ensure the student understands its practical importance.
- 5. For those points which are marked Needs Improvement, discuss how the student can bring up their mark and agree on deadlines to do so, if they choose this option. Suggested deadline is no later than the end of their upcoming module (6 or 11).
- 6. If student disagrees with a mentor's evaluation, mentor can suggest a joint meeting with a second mentor present.

Apply score in left column as follows:

Exemplary-5; Outstanding-4; Excellent-3; Acceptable-2; Needs Improvement-1.
